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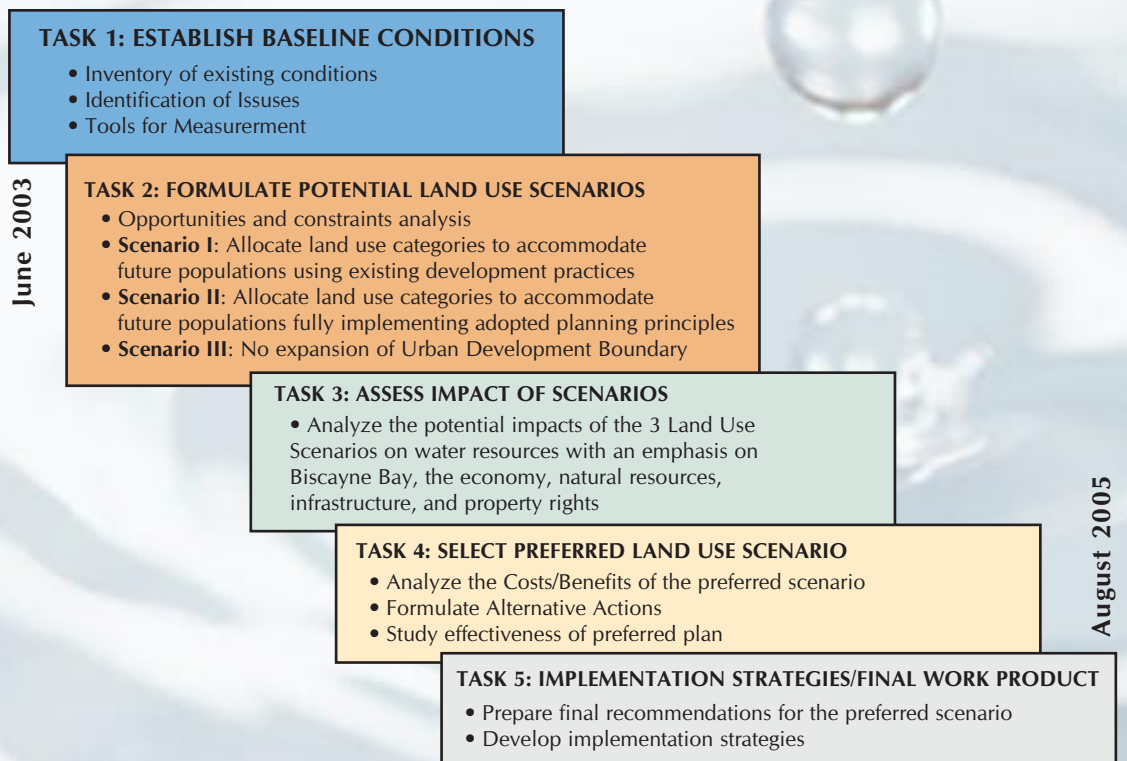
Planning for a Sustainable & Healthy Environment and Economy

What is the South Miami-Dade Watershed Study and Plan (SMDWSP)?

- The SMDWSP is a comprehensive planning effort that will provide the framework for making future land use decisions over the next 50 years.
- The SMDWSP includes a Study of the region's population, economy and environment. It will analyze the area's population growth; infrastructure; land ownership including agricultural, industrial and urban land uses; property rights; pollution; water resources (with emphasis on Biscayne Bay); wildlife; and natural areas by following the step-by-step approach outlined below.
- The SMDWSP will result in a long term Plan, uniquely designed to balance the various competing interests in South Miami-Dade County and provide for a sustainable economy and environment.

How will the SMDWSP be accomplished? ...the Process

The Study has been laid out in a series of five tasks that progressively build upon each other. This step-by-step approach allows for an organized 26-month journey through a series of milestones to a final set of recommendations - the Plan.
